Supporting Infrastructure works at:

Northumberland Energy Park (NEP) - part of the Energy Central area around the Port of Blyth and Blyth Estuary

Located to the north of the Port of Blyth close to Cambois, the NEP area includes:

- ✔ Strategic Power plants, including North Sea Link (Norway/Blyth) Interconnector facility, EDF Renewables, Northern PowerGrid and National Grid.
- ✔ JDR Cables – investing £130m in Subsea cable manufacturing facility (Former Blyth Power Station Site) creating 170 new jobs and safeguarding 270 jobs.
- ✔ Britishvolt – Battery Giga Factory, investing £2.6bn in new Advanced Manufacturing Facility and creating 3,500 new jobs over the next 5 years (Former Coal Stocking Yard)
- ✔ A transformed former Blyth Power Station with deep water berth at Ash Barge Dock, for large vessels serving JDR Cables and the wider Energy Central area.



Energy Central Facts

- ✔ Fully operational hub consisting of world-leading organisations, skills and infrastructure
- ✔ Large cluster of industry and operations serving the energy, offshore wind and subsea sectors
- ✔ It contains 200 Hectares of strategic, quay linked, development sites with access to low carbon power.
- ✔ Several 'live' infrastructure projects to capture further investment and improve facilities
- ✔ Business driven links to existing and new training facilities including the Energy Central Campus Phases 1 and 2, to ensure local people can obtain the necessary skills to enter the sector
